Sermon outline notes: Spiritual Warfare part 2 Christus Victor

Introduction

The power of darkness is real, it is an enemy but an enemy which has been overcome in Christ: 'It has met it's match and been trodden under by Jesus'. The New Testament presents us with a picture of a triumphant Christ, one who through humiliation and suffering did what was necessary to destroy the power of evil.

1) Victory in Christ.

- Synoptic Gospels: Matt 12:29 The binding of the strong man
- John's Gospel: John 12: 31-32
- Paul: Colossians 2:10,14,15
 In this passage Paul moves from the forgiveness of sins to the victory of the cross since it is through the guilt of men and women that the dark powers are able to hold them in their power.

 The picture here is of a victory parade.
- Peter: 1Peter 3:18 –22
- Revelation 12
 A scene of conflict. The conquest of the devil is made possible by the blood of the Lamb and the word of their testimony.
- 2) The clear testimony of the New Testament is to the victory of Christ over all the powers of darkness through the cross and resurrection.
 - Gustav Aulen 'Christus Victor' Aulen put forward the view that
 we need to recapture the concept of victory to explain the cross.
 It is the Church's role to announce the breaking of Satan's
 power..... that Christ is raised from the dead and enthroned as
 King over all.
 - John Stott sees six stages in this drama!
 - 1. It is predicted in the Old Testament
 - 2. It is begun in the ministry of Jesus as demons are cast out, sicknesses are healed.
 - 3. It is achieved at the cross where the prince of this world is driven out
 - 4. It is confirmed and announced in the resurrection when the victory of the cross was proclaimed and demonstrated.

- 5. It is extended as the Church preaches Christ in the power of the Spirit.
- 6. It will be consummated when Christ returns and makes this victory universal and total.

Conclusion

'For my part I am persuaded that no form of Christian teaching has any future before it except such as can keep steadily in view the reality of evil in the world and go to meet it with the battle song of triumph'.

Gustav Aulen.

Points to Ponder

- 1) Did the sermon make sense? Was there anything said which you did not understand or with which you would disagree?
- 2) Would you agree with Gustav Aulen's statement above? Do we need to have much more confidence/ understanding of Christ's victory over the spiritual powers of darkness, and the reality of spiritual warfare
- 3) Ephesians 6: 10-20. The devil's schemes. What does Paul have in mind here? See also 2 Corinthians 2:11
