Sermon outline notes: Resurrection Part 5 Acts 1:1-11; 2:22-36 Resurrection and the Spirit

Introduction

First of all a recap of the past 4 sermons on resurrection:-

Sermon 1— a need to be careful in our use of the phrase 'going to heaven when we die'

Sermon 2—resurrection as an event spit into two—Jesus was 'raised in advance' and is the guarantee of the final resurrection of all God's people at the end of history.

Sermon 3— there are many views around about 'life after death': annihilation, reincarnation, absorption into nature, spirit survival. None of these are what the Bible teaches— the Creeds talk about the resurrection of the dead. Or resurrection of the body.

Sermon 4— there is overwhelming circumstantial evidence for the resurrection of Jesus.

1) Peter's Pentecost Sermon

- Disciples told to wait for the gift of the Spirit.
- Spirit comes and Peter preaches about Jesus' death and resurrection.
- Crowds are convicted and respond. We see here the often repeated pattern of preaching—response—receiving the Spirit—baptism. This is the 'normal Christian birth'.

2) The Holy Spirit as God's empowering presence

- The Holy Spirit confirms in our experience that God is indeed our Father.
- The Holy Spirit moves in our hearts and minds to 'allow us' to confess Jesus is Lord.

3) Ephesians 1:17-22

• Notice particularly verses 19-20: a stunning verse which indicates that the same power by which God raised Jesus is available to us.

4) Romans 8: 11 can be summed up like this:

- The Spirit indwells/lives in you
- The Spirit is the Spirit of God who raised Jesus
- Jesus is the Messiah/Christ and you belong to him
- The God who raised Jesus the Messiah/Christ will raise all of Messiah's people, you included.

Points to Ponder

- 1) Was anything said that you did not understand? Was anything said that you disagreed with? Why?
- 2) In Peter's Pentecost Sermon in Acts 2 what stands out for you? Why?
- 3) Baptism and dying and raising with Christ—study carefully Romans 6: 1–14. What is Paul saying here?
- 4) Reflect upon/unpack what Ephesians 1:19-20 mean for you today in your Christian life.
