Sermon outline notes: Revelation 2 and 3 Hearing What the Spirit say to the Churches

1) The Portrayal of the Lord Jesus Christ

- The opening to each letter is drawn from the magnificent description of the risen glorified Jesus found in chapter 1
- This is not the 'gentle Jesus meek and mild' but the 'Alpha and Omega.' This is the one who in chapter 19 ride's out with the title 'King of Kings and Lord of Lords'.

2) I Know Your Deeds

- This phrase occurs in 6 of the 7 letters.
- There is an emphasis on 'deeds', because deeds are the measure, the criterion of the genuineness of faith.

3) A constant repetition of the word 'repent' - 2:5; 2:16; 2:22; 3:3, 3:19.

- We need to reflect on our own lives and express repentance for our failings.
- Elements of repentance—a knowledge of sin, a knowledge of failure, a confession of that failure, a turning away from wrong doing, putting right wherever possible what has been wrong.
- See 2 Corinthians 7: 8-13 a contrast drawn between godly sorrow and worldly sorrow.

4) The use of the word 'tolerate'

- Twice used negatively—2:14 and 2:20 and once positively—2:2
- There are certain issues on which the church cannot be tolerant and on which it must speak out!

5) A challenge to 'reassess' our understanding of 'success'

• Smyrna described as poor but rich; Laodicea described as rich but poor. There is no correlation between material prosperity and spiritual riches.

6) 'To him who overcomes' - a challenge to the individual.

• Overcomes is a significant word because it does indicate the fact that our Christian lives will meet opposition.

• But linked to that challenge to overcome there is a tremendous series of rewards—acquitted at the last judgement—2:10; 3:5, the gift of eternal life—2:7, 2:16, 2:27, 3:5; a share in Christ's rule—2:26, 3:21; a place in the City of God.

Points to Ponder

- 1) Was anything said with which you disagreed? Why?
- 2) Last week I asked for you to draw up a list of common themes from these letters. How did they compare with the list mentioned in the sermon?
- 3) Hebrews 10:24 'Let us consider how we may spur one another on towards love and good deeds'. Work out practically how we do this.
- 4) How has the series on the seven letters spoken to you? Has it changed your understanding in any way? Have you determined to be different in any regard? Share with your group.
