SERMON OUTLINE NOTES

'Do not think I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfil them' Matthew 5:17

1) Introduction

Fulfil the Prophets—What does Jesus mean? I want to suggest that what Jesus means when he says that is far deeper and far more significant than just fulfilling predictions.

2) Who were the Prophets?

- The Prophets we are dealing with this morning belong to a particular stage in the Israelite history of prophecy. They are called the 'latter prophets'.
- There were 8th century prophets— Amos, Hosea, Isaiah, Micah who anticipated the destruction of the northern Kingdom of Israel. There are also 6th century prophets who can be divided into three groups—pre-exilic (Jeremiah), exilic (Ezekiel), post exilic (Haggai, Zephaniah etc.)
- The latter prophets all come from an historical period fairly late in the history of Israel – they belong to the closing stages of the Old Testament story of Israel.
- The true prophet was a check and balance to the king.

3) The Message of the Prophets

- The 8th century prophets began to announce the end has come for the northern kingdom of Israel. The 6th century prophets then announce also the judgement upon the southern Kingdom of Judah. The prophetic books are dominated by gloom and doom.
- However in the midst of the terrible message of judgement, there began to be heard a message of a new future: there is still a future to look forward to.

- The way the prophets spoke about the future was distinctive. It was not just a restitution of the past, not just a reversal of exile—No it was going to be a new age, a new day.
- 4) 'Jesus fulfilled the words of the prophets because the purpose of God for both judgement and salvation was realised in Jesus'.
 - The message of judgement that we hear ringing through the Old Testament prophets point to the cross.
 - The promises of God for salvation have been fulfilled in Jesus. A new exodus was promised and the gospel says you have now been set free from your sins. A new land was promised and the gospel says you have now been set free from your sins. A new land was promised and the gospel announces that God has qualified us to share in the inheritance of the saints. A new king was promised and the gospel announces the Kingdom of this world has become the Kingdom of our Lord and of his Christ. A new temple was promised and the gospel announces that we are God's temple and God's Spirit lives in us.

Conclusion

Jesus fulfilled the words of the prophets in a far deeper and more significant sense than just fulfilling predictions. Jesus fulfilled the words of the prophets because the purpose of God for judgement and salvation in the words of the prophets were realised in Jesus
